## RE Term 5 Knowledge Organiser - For Christians, what was the impact of Pentecost?







## Pupils should know:

- Christians believe God is Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- Christians believe The Father creates; he sends the Son who saves his people; the Son sends the Holy Spirit to his followers.

## Sticky Knowledge:

- Pentecost is a Christian celebration fifty days after Good Friday.
- Christians believe that Jesus' whole life was a demonstration of his belief that God is King, not just in heaven but here and now ('Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven')
- Christians believe Jesus is still alive, and rules in their hearts and lives by the Holy Spirit, if they let him.
- Christians believe that after Jesus returned to be with God the Father, he sent the Holy Spirit at Pentecost to help the Church.
- Christians celebrate Pentecost as the beginning of the Church.

Key Vocabulary	
Apostles	Any of the 12 disciples chosen by Jesus Christ.
Crucifixion	Referring to the death of Jesus on a cross. A Roman punishment.
Holy Week	The last week of Jesus' earthly life, starting on Palm Sunday.
Salvation	The act of saving or being saved.
Incarnation	The birth of Jesus - God the Son in human flesh.
Pentecost	A Christian festival that marks the coming of the Holy Spirit.
Resurrection	Christians believe Jesus rose from the dead and became "Christ", the risen one, the Messiah.
Disciples	Someone who is following Jesus, being changed by Jesus, and is committed to the mission of Jesus
Holy Spirit	Third person of the Trinity. God in the form of an unseen power.  Part of God that lives in Christians.
Trinity	The state of being three. Here, God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit
Kingdom of God	What God wants the world to be like.
