English

In reading, we will continue to use VIPERS to engage with texts. Pupils will work together to read a book as well as engaging with shorter non-fiction texts.

We will also be working on developing our spelling and handwriting skills through weekly lessons/daily tasks. The spelling pattern for each week will be provided for homework and set as practice on spelling shed.

Our writing this term begins with fiction, where we explore the genre of science fiction, through a retelling of part of the story 'The Kid who came from Space'. We will then go on to write complex instructions linked to our topic about Roman Britain. Throughout these tasks, we will be developing our understanding of sentence construction, grammar and punctuation.

- Multiply up to 4-digit by 2-digit using long multiplication.
- Multiply a 1-digit number by a decimal.
- Divide a 4-digit number by a 1-digit number using short division with and without a remainder.

- To know what congruence means.
- To carry out translations.
- To carry out and describe reflections.


Maths

Year 6:

- Equivalence between fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Using the order of operations (BIDMAS) to calculate where there are multiple steps.
- Multiply proper fractions
- Divide fractions by an integer
- Add and subtract fractions where the denominators are not multiples
- Add and subtract mixed numbers where wholes need to be broken.

Science

Year 4:

This term's topic is all about sound. We will explore the key concepts of how sound is produced and what effects the pitch and volume of different sounds.

Year 5 and Year 6:

This term's topic continues to explore materials, this time looking at how they combine to form new materials.

The children will be encouraged to observe signs indicating that a chemical change has taken place, such as a change of temperature or production of a gas.

We will try to determine what is important to Jews and why they might behave in certain ways.
