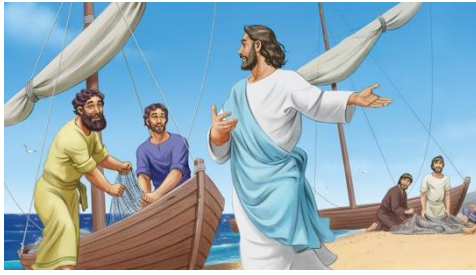


RE Term 5 Knowledge Organiser – What kind of world did Jesus want?



Key objectives we will explore:

- To understand the story of the calling of the first disciples.
- To understand what kind of world Jesus wanted.
- To understand the story of the Good Samaritan and what it means to Christians.
- To learn about Christian leaders who goes above and beyond in their everyday life.
- To design my own ideal world.

Key Knowledge:

- Jesus is also known as the 'fisher of men'. This is how he called the first disciples, when Jesus performed the miracle of the fish. For Christians nowadays, a vicar may identify with Jesus, trying to lead others in their walk with God.
- Christians try to put Jesus actions and teaching into practice in lots of ways, including church worship and social justice.
- Christians believe Jesus shows people how to love God and their neighbour.
- 'Fishers of men' is a phrase used in the gospels to describe the order given by Jesus to his first disciples.
- Jesus spread his ministry through his teachings and trusted disciples. These twelve special individuals to help him spread the 'Good News'.
- Leprosy is an infectious disease that causes severe, disfiguring skin sores and nerve damage in the arms, legs, and around your body. It has existed since ancient times. Those with leprosy were often separated from others in the community as they were frightened!
- This story of the Good Samaritan shows that Christians believe they should show mercy and compassion to everyone no matter who they are.

Vocabulary

Neighbour	A person who lives next door or lives close by
Leper	A person suffering from leprosy/ A person who is rejected by others.
Disciples	A personal follower of Jesus.
Samaritan	A person from a place called Samaria in biblical times. Now: a guardian who helps and keeps people safe.
Parable	A simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels.
Gospel	Good news. These are four biblical narratives (stories) about the life and death of Jesus. They were written by: St Matthew, St Mark, St Luke and St John.
