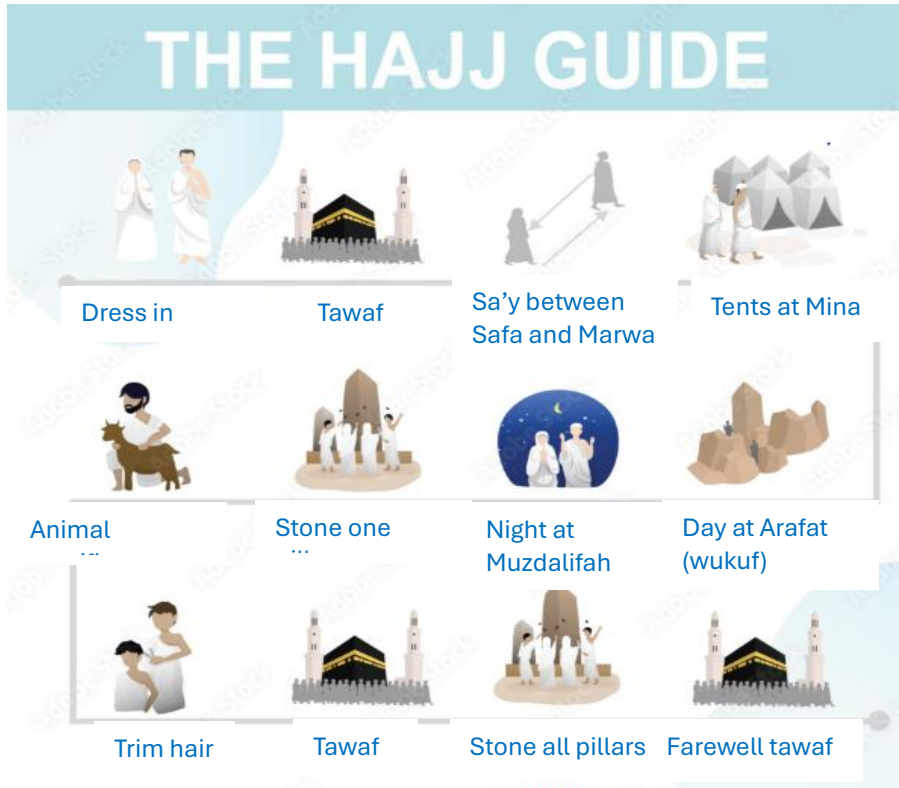


How does Hajj show what matters to Muslims in Britain?

Hajj	Religious pilgrimage made by Muslims to Makkah in Saudi Arabia	All Muslims should make the pilgrimage to Makkah once in their lifetime if they are able to do so.
Kaaba	A cube-shaped building at the centre of the Great Mosque in Makkah. It is the holiest site in Islam	During Hajj, pilgrims take part in rituals, many based on important stories from the
Quiblah	The direction that Muslims face for prayer – they always pray towards the Kaaba	All pilgrims wear white robes to show they are equal.
salah	Muslim prayer	The Hajj is an opportunity for the community of Muslims around the world (Ummah) to come together.
ritual	A way of doing something in which the same actions are done in the same way every time	Over 1.5 million Muslims will take part in the Hajj each year.

wukuf	Being in a holy place – on the Hajj, this is the time spent in prayer and contemplation at Mount Arafat	
Eid-ul-adha	The 'festival of sacrifice' held on the last day of Hajj
