Reception children join us from the September following their 4th birthday.

Children planning to join us are invited to come for a number of visits during the Summer term before starting school. We listen to parents to devise transition arrangements that suit their child's needs, enabling full time places to be offered as soon as children are ready.

We open the school from 8:00 am for children to be supervised and run an after school club called Bibury Oaks. This is open to all children from 3:15- 4:15 pm every day. These sessions are supervised by professionally trained staff and offer a range of activities. The club is very popular with the children.

What makes Bibury different? How does a small school work?

Bibury Church of England primary school is a very small school, divided up into three teaching groups, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, Years 3 and 4 and Years 5 and 6.

An experienced teacher leads each Key Stage, supported by specialist teachers and teaching assistants. Classes are typically less than 15 enabling our teachers to be flexible in their approach, planning lessons around the needs of each individual child.
