## Sticky Knowledge

- Most Christians are monotheists (they believe in one God) who believe in the Trinity.
- The Trinity is made up of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.
- For many Christians, evidence of the Trinity can be found in the Bible and a summary of it in the **Apostles' Creed**
- The Apostles' Creed is a statement of Christian beliefs. It is not used by all Christian Churches
- Many Christians have different ideas on the relationship between Father, Son and Holy Spirit and how these influence their lives.
- There are differences in how Christians focus on the Holy Spirit in worship.
- Many Christians find it hard to explain what the Holy Spirit is.
- There is evidence in the bible that although the Holy Spirit was sent to help the Apostles after Jesus' death, it existed before this.
