## **Mathematics**

# Science: 'We're Evolving'

This term, we will learning about how some traits are inherited from parents through genes by looking at human families and dogs. We will explore how some plants and animals are adapted to their environment and link this to Darwin's theory that those best adapted will survive, leading to gradual evolution. We will explore particular species and how these have evolved over time and explore what fossils can tell us about creatures that used to live on the Earth. We also look at how animals have adapted to survive in their habitats.

# **English**

We begin the term with a unit of non-fiction explanatory writing based on our geography learning from last term.

We begin with narrative writing based on the book 'Rose Blanche', which looks at the second world war through the eyes of a young German girl.

We will then be looking at recount writing, using the novel 'Letters from the Lighthouse' as inspiration.

Our reading texts this term will be linked to our history and science units

In grammar, we begin by learning about expanded noun phrases. We then look at adding and punctuating additional information to sentences. Finally, we look at how the meaning of words changes when prefixes or suffixes are added.

# R.E. Creation and Science: Complementary or conflicting

We will explore the story of creation in Genesis and compare this with cosmological theories about the beginning of the world, considering whether people of faith are able to accept the scientific view and whether scientists are able to believe that God is the creator.

## Computing

Coding using 'Espresso'.

#### R.S.H.E Valuing differences

This topic explores the value of diversity, celebrating differences between ourselves and others. We will also think about the qualities of friendship and how to listen well to others. We will develop an understanding of discrimination and how to challenge it. We consider how published information is not necessarily true. We also learn what is meant by stereotypes.

#### Music - Music of WW2

This term, we begin by looking at different genres of music before focussing on singing technique. We look at identifying the pitch of notes and how to sing in parts, before notating a piece of music.

#### P.E

Swimming, dance and gymnastics. We also have 2 additional team-building sessions with the PE development officer for this area.

## Art and design: drawing/printing

The children will begin by using tone to create '3D' images. They then work on creating a sense of proportion. They then look at using mixed media, wax resist and printing to create images.

## French: As-tu un animal? (Do you have a pet?)

In this unit pupils will learn how to:

Repeat, recognise and attempt to spell the eight nouns for pets in French.

Tell somebody in French if they have or do not have a pet and ask somebody else if they have a pet.
Tell somebody in French the name of their pet.
Create a longer phrase using the conjunctions et ("and") or mais ("but").

# History: What was the impact of WW2?

This unit looks at how the lives of ordinary people, particularly children were affected by war. As part of this topic, we will have a WW2 cookery session with Kitchen Club and will visit the STEAM museum in Swindon where children will have some experience of what it was like to be evacuated and of how family life may have changed.
